



5 Focus Groups

- The majority of EU students don't wish to pursue further higher education in UK due to the fear of not being able to finance it. However, the group does believe that living in the UK will be more comfortable than in their countries even after Brexit.
- > Home based students (UK) do wish to continue with their further education but won't necessarily stay in the country afterwards. Brexit influences their decision about traveling after university.
- > The majority of international non-EU students are willing to stay in the UK & wish to continue.





Recommendations

- > Clear university guidelines reducing uncertainty about the future of the UK.
- > Benefits by government through loans and maintenance grants to be continued.
 - > Universities should continue easier regulations for EU students' admissions.
